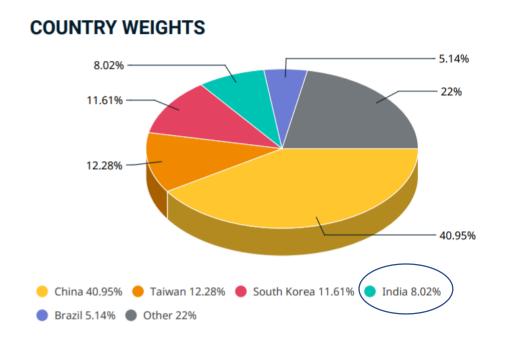

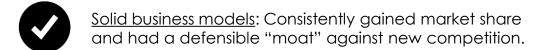

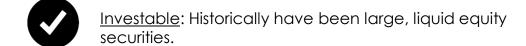

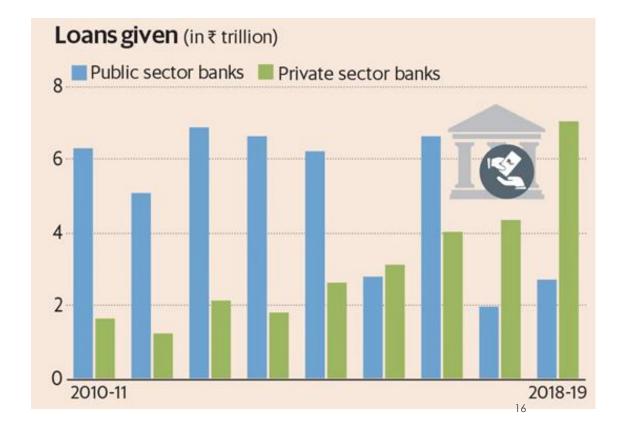

- For example, the largest private sector bank – HDFC Bank – has grown its assets and earnings at a high-teens compounded annual growth rate (CAGR) over the last 5 years

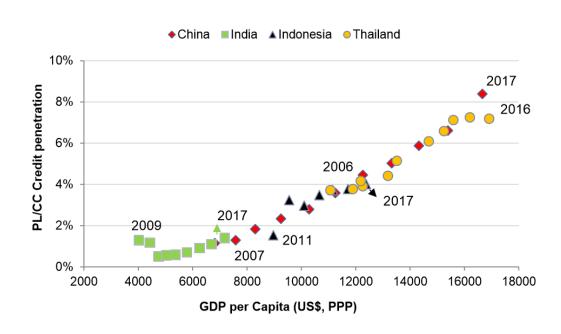

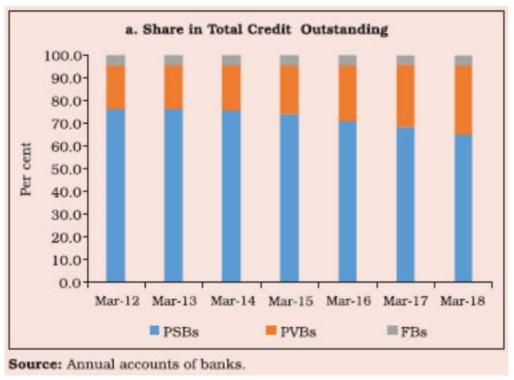
# Potentially Decades Of Runway For Growth

Inside a state-owned Indian bank branch



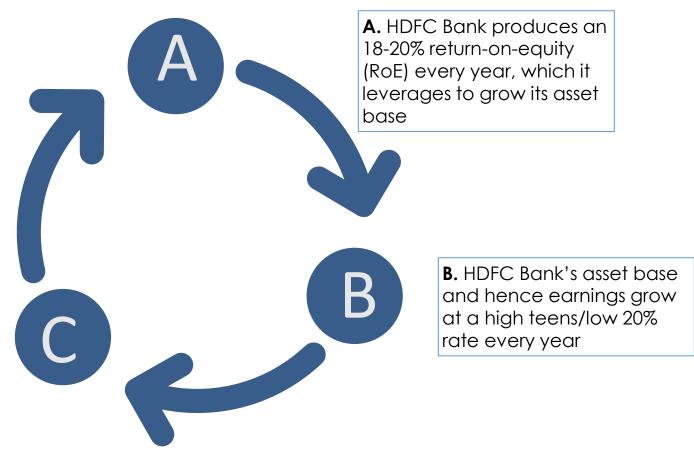






# HDFC Bank Case Study: "Rinse & Repeat"

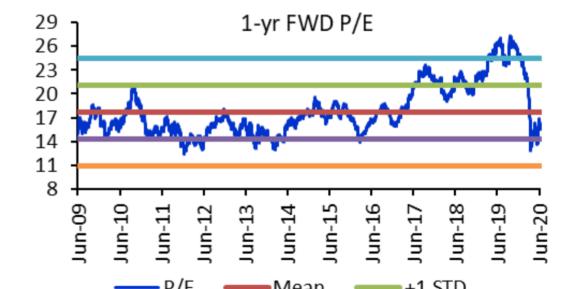

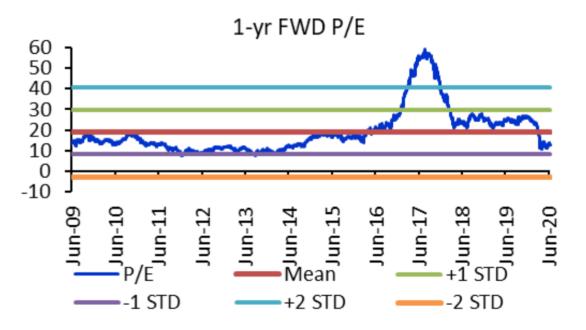

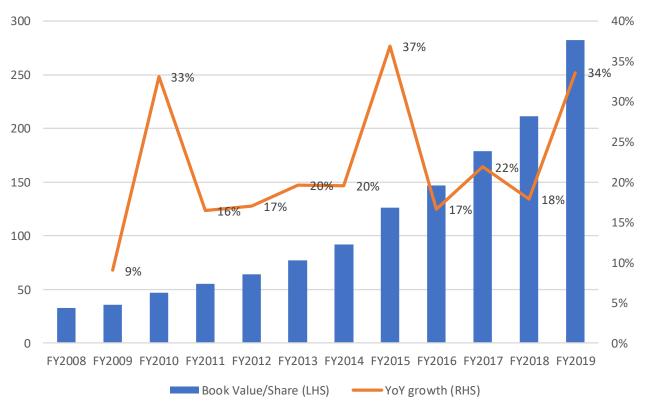

# HDFC Bank Book Value **Grew**Through The Global Financial Crisis (GFC)



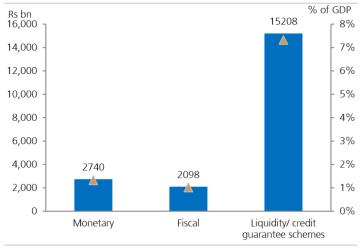
### India's Covid-19 Stimulus

- In contrast to the US stimulus program which has centered around large direct transfers to individuals and small businesses and the Fed's direct purchase of financial assets ("demand side response"), India's stimulus has focused on incentivizing banks to lend ("supply side reform").
- Combined with RBI's rate cuts, India's stimulus is likely to be more bank-friendly in the medium term.
- Sovereign credit guarantee has the potential to improve credit growth as well as loan losses going forward.

"If there was no sovereign guarantee for some of the weaker MSMEs, we would be more cautious. But if the sovereign is stepping in, we will step up. That's the bottom line."

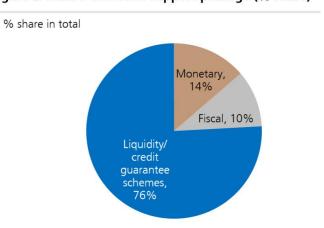

Figure 2: India's economic support package (% share)

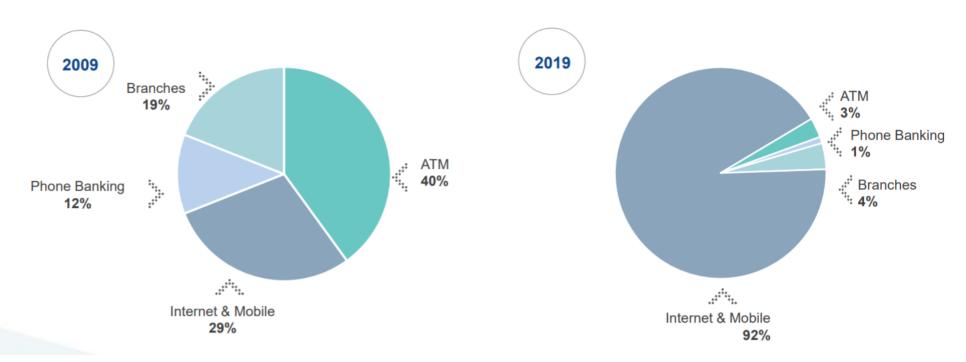

#### Number of Transactions By Channel



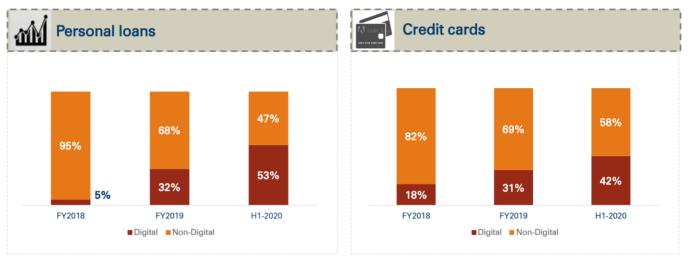

Share of digital sourcing: personal loans & cards

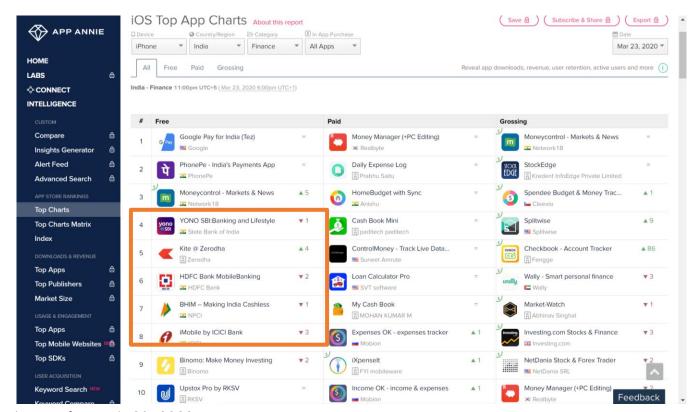


Cost of acquisition and delinquencies (90+) substantially lower
